Lohman Ford Road Repaving Project Underway

The Texas winter storm greatly affected our state and citizens, shutting down power grids and leaving more than 8.7 billion Texans under boil water notices. Just over three months have passed, and cities are still working to repair critical infrastructure that was damaged in the freeze.

Many state and local roads were also unable to avoid the destructive affects of

the storm. Locally, Lohman Ford Road suffered damage due to a normal process called a freeze-thaw cycle. This cycle is something northern states struggle with on a constant basis. In fact, many Northerners humorously refer to spring and summer as "construction season" since roadway damage from harsh winter freezes with intermittent thaws is typical. For those of us living in warm Central Texas, this type of damage may seem shocking.

What is a freeze-thaw cycle?

A freeze-thaw cycle occurs when temperatures fluctuate from above freezing (32F) to below freezing, and then back to up again to above freezing. When temperatures are above freezing, rainwater or snow melt will make its way into any small crack in the pavement. Water underneath the pavement is meant to drain away, but during winter it freezes in the base and subgrade materials. So, when temperatures drop below freezing, the water within the cracked pavement begins to freeze and expand, causing the crack to expand and grow as well. When warmer weather comes, the ice begins to melt, weakening the base layer and leaving voids where larger cracks were formed. Eventually, potholes appear.

City of Lago Vista Public Works Department is coordinating with a City Council-selected contractor to complete the Lohman Ford Street Rehab Project. The project, which had been planned before the storm, needed to be put out for new bids because the expected scope of work increased due to the storm damage. After review of all new bids, Bennet Paving, the contractor who successfully paved Boggy Ford, was awarded the project with a bid amount of \$937,875.97.

The Lohman Ford Rehab project consists of paving the entire approximate 87,576 square yards of Lohman Ford Road, removal and replacement of reflective traffic buttons, edge tapering, and creating rough traction areas around the curves for drivers' safety. Roadway striping will be performed after paving work has been completed.

Work is scheduled to begin in early June. All work is expected to be completed by July 4 weather permitting. Most of the work will be performed at night to keep traffic interruptions to a minimum. There will be temporary lane markers before the roadway is striped. If possible, drivers are encouraged to avoid Lohman Ford Road during the entire month of June for their and the workers' safety as well as to protect the new pavement until it is ready to accept heavy traffic.




What is a City Charter and How Does it Affect You?
