Be Ready for Winter Storms BEFORE They Happen



-Make Sure Your Home is Ready-

- Winterize your home with insulation, caulking, and weather stripping.
- Learn how to keep interior and exterior pipes from freezing.
- Clear rain gutters, repair roof leaks, check your roof to make sure it can handle the extra weight of the snow and ice, and cut away tree branches that could fall on a house or neighboring structure.
- Install and test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors with battery backups.
- Have your chimney or flue inspected each year.
- Consider buying alternative heating resources. All heaters that run on fuel (natural gas, kerosene, butane, oil) should be vented.
- When purchasing a space heater, look for one that has an automatic shut-off or tip-over switch. Place the heater on a level surface away from high-traffic areas and flammable items, such as curtains, bedding, or furniture. Never use an extension cord - plug your space heater directly into the electrical outlet.



-Make Sure Your Vehicle is Ready-

- Create an emergency supply kit for your vehicle. Include matches, a windshield scraper, jumper cables, a flashlight, warm clothes, blankets, bottled water, non-perishable snacks, and a bright cloth to tie to the antenna.
- Store a small broom and a small sack of sand in your vehicle for generating traction under wheels and a set of tire chains or traction mats.
- Winterize your vehicle before the winter storm season to decrease your chance of being stranded in cold weather.
- Have a mechanic check your battery, antifreeze, wipers and windshield washer fluid, lights, flashing hazard lights, heater, brakes, defroster and oil.

Parks & Recreation

The City of Lago Vista offers 4 different parks for you to enjoy that are all managed and maintained by our Parks & Recreation Department. Sunset Park is our largest park which offers walking & biking trails, a soccer field, a volleyball court, a baseball/softball field, a scent garden, a playground, picnic tables, benches, and restrooms. Bowden Point Park offers picnic tables, benches, gardens and art sculptures. City Hall Park offers picnic tables, benches and a small walking trail with a featured art sculpture. Veterans Memorial Park offers a gazebo with a 5-pointed star and flags of the five branches of military service, the Path Of Honor walkway containing engraved bricks with the names of honored veterans, which is guarded by five granite totems representing soldiers from each branch of service, and features a bald eagle sculpture.

Winter Sewer Averaging

Your actual water usage during the months of November 2023 - February 2024 are reviewed to determine your sewer rate for your monthly bill. The lowest two months of metered water usage of those four are then averaged to determine your new sewer rate. These months are deliberately chosen because they tend to have the lowest consumption for most customers. The end result is that those who are conservative in their usage will pay less for sewer services. Those who use more water and place a greater burden on the treatment facilities will pay more. New winter averaging rates will be calculated in April of 2024 and due on your bills beginning in May 2024.
